

## **Catch-Up Seven Report**

### **How much funding has been received?**

- £10,000 was received in 2013/14, £8,500 in 2014/15 and £4,000 in 2015/16.

### **How has the funding been spent?**

- The Catch-Up Seven funding has paid for a small Year Seven English progress class, which provides students who achieved L3 or lower at KS2 with additional support in developing literacy skills.
- Year Seven students also receive a range of other literacy provisions, as appropriate to individual needs, including the provision of sound training.
- Numeracy provisions, such as paired numeracy and numicon, have also been developed to support the progress of students who did not reach age related expectation.

### **Impact of Funding**

- All of the five students who did not attain L4 in literacy are now projected to achieve their baselines in English, which are based on the ambitious measure of all students achieving four levels of progress by the end of Y11.
- Seven students did not attain L4 in numeracy. All these students are projected to achieve three or more levels of progress in Mathematics by the end of Y11.
